The Invitatory Antiphons

Any time	The earth is the Lord's for he made it: * O come, let us adore him. Worship the Lord in the beauty • of holiness: * O come, let us adore him. The mercy of the Lord is everlasting: * O come, let us adore him.
Advent	Our King and Savior now draws near: * O come, let us adore him.
Christmas	Alleluia, to us a child is born: * O come, let us adore him. Alleluia
Epiphany, Transfiguration	The Lord has shown forth his glory: * O come, let us adore him.
Presentation, Annunciation	The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us: * O come, let us adore him.
Lent	The Lord is full of com passion • and mercy: * O come, let us adore him.
Easter to Ascension	Alleluia. The Lord is risen • indeed: * O come, let us adore him. Alleluia
Ascension to Pentecost	Alleluia. Christ the Lord has ascended into heaven: * O come, let us adore him. Alleluia
Day of Pentecost	Alleluia, the Spirit of the Lord renews the face of • the earth: * O come, let us adore him. Alleluia
Trinity Sunday	Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God: * O come, let us adore him.
All Saints', Saints' Days	The Lord is glorious in his saints: * O come, let us adore him.

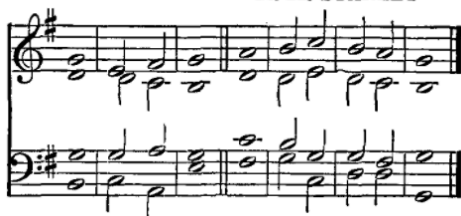

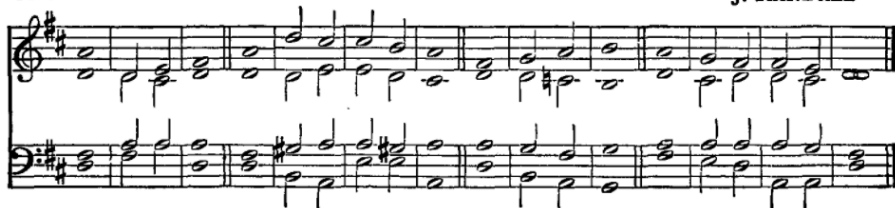
